2021 YEAR IN REVIEW

2021 Highlights include:

\$30,000 granted to five significant endeavors related to health and welfare of animals.

\$32,000 in grants supporting specific causes for 25 local not-for-profit agencies.

\$16,000 raised on Giving Tuesday to support the Trails Initiative.

\$56,000 raised at the annual Champagne Campaign to support our annual grant round.



The CFL is thrilled to have the local chapter of the Dream Factory join as an agency partner. This nonprofit grants dreams to children ages three through eighteen who are critically or chronically ill. They believe that children with chronic conditions also suffer from both physical and emotional pain dealing with their day-to-day challenges. To

be approved for a dream, the child's condition must be physical, not resulting from an accident, and not mental/emotional. It is also important that the dream be that of the child, and not of other family members. The child must be able to communicate his or her dream to the Dream Factory screening volunteers.

The local chapter raises their own funds and use those funds to grant the dreams of local children. Without a current corporate sponsor, they depend on donations from individuals and organizations. Two annual fundraisers are: The Clown Golf Tournament at Osage National in the Spring and the HyVee Halloween Hallow in October. They usually grant 8-10 dreams per year and to date have granted over 400 dreams. The average cost of each dream is \$5000-6000, depending on the dream and on the size of the family if travel is involved.

THE CHILDREN'S LEARNING CENTER RECEIVES \$30,000 GRANT.

Working with grant chair Jane Wright, the center's Executive Director, Adrienne Anderson, successfully applied for a grant to enhance and expand the Children's Learning Center, located in Camdenton. As part of the Ozarks Early Childhood Support Grant Program Fall 2021, this grant will allow the facility to purchase a room system to combine supervisory space in three different rooms of the facility. The system comes complete with room divid-



ers, shelving, ADA approved gates, mirrors, and a blackboard. The center will also be able to purchase tables to seat more children, a new play kitchen and dramatic play center for an expanded classroom, a new sensory table, additional cots for napping, and support additional outdoor play equipment that will allow for better use of the facility's space. As an Agency Partner of the CFL, the Children's Learning Center has access to these grant opportunities.



Adrienne stated "I am excited to use this grant to break down the partition walls that we currently have in our motor room! This new wall system will allow for increased supervision of the lunch/art room, motor room, and classroom all at the same time. Floor space will be maximized and allow for more seating and space for activities and free play." These wonderful ladies at Children's Center were also kind enough to volunteer at the Champagne Campaign to help support the CFL. 2021 CFL GRANT ROUND

\$32,000 was granted out to local non-profits at the end of January, thanks to our benefactors and local business owners who have supported CFL for many years. CFL carefully vets grant requests and follows up with a 6-month grant review to guarantee that grant money is correctly spent as intended. CFL coordinates and collaborates with many non-profit agency partners throughout the year. We offer free seminars, we help with grant writing, and most importantly CFL has a non-profit link on our website where a donor can find a local non-profit and donate directly from the CFL website.

Multi-Surface Trails Development Update

We shared in our newsletter last year that CFL had formed an exploratory committee to investigate feasibility of developing recreational trails in the Lake area. After much research, discussion with community leaders, and visits to communities with extensive trail systems, we are pleased to announce we are moving forward with development of the Magic Dragon Trail Project. The committee found that development of world-class recreational trails can increase property values, promote year-round tourism, improve community health, re-vitalize existing businesses, bring new businesses to the area and provide family-friendly activities all while enjoying the natural beauty of the Lake Area.

Thanks to our Legacy Master donors, we have hired a professional design firm to develop a Master Plan for both hard-surface and soft-surface trails for walking, jogging, biking, mountain biking and trail running. Jan Pyrtle, co-chair of the committee stated "We truly appreciate the community leaders who have stepped up in support of the Magic Dragon Trail project either by providing monetary donations or volunteering to provide in-kind assistance. They truly embraced the vision of recreational

trails as just another great way to continue the lake tradition of multigenerational family entertainment.". The first phase of the Magic Dragon Trails will likely be on the west side of the Grand Glaize bridge and will provide connectivity to businesses and area attractions. We are also partnering with the Tri-County YMCA to build a bike skills park and half mile of nature trail on their property. We hope to develop trail hubs across the entire Lake Area and eventually have a spur from the Rock Island bike trail in Eldon to the Lake.
